- 3. On pages 130-2, in a section titled "Why the Death Penalty is Inconsistent with the Value of Justice" Nathanson argues that the death penalty is inconsistent with the value of justice. Why does he say so? Is he right and why?
- 4. On pages 132-5 in a section titled "Why the Death Penalty is Inconsistent with Respect for the Value of Human Life" Nathanson argues that the death penalty is inconsistent with the respect for the value of human life. Why does he say so? Is he right and why?
