Short Writing Assignment 6: Using cases to counterexample views

On page 185, today's author, Feldman, offers a view called "Justicized Act Utilitarianism" (JAU) that he thinks tells us when killing is wrong. You should offer a case that counterexamples his view. (There are two ways to do so: (a) offer a case in which killing is morally wrong but JAU would say it's not (b) offer a case in which killing isn't morally wrong but JAU would say it is.) (Some suggestions: (1) check out the class notes from last Friday on using cases to counterexample a view. (2) JAU is complicated; to understand it, you will probably have to read pages 182-90, perhaps multiple times. Let me know if you have questions about what it means! Remember to interpret charitably!).
