## Discussion Questions for March 27

There are no readings for today's class; instead you should think through the following questions.

## Background:

Today I'm going to ask you various questions about affirmative action as it relates to Notre Dame.

## Questions:

- 1. One of the big motivations for affirmative action is that diversity has various benefits. Notre Dame's student body is not as diverse as the US population as a whole when it comes to race, ethnicity, religion, age and socio-economic status. How has this impacted your experience at Notre Dame, both in and out of class? In what ways would it be better or worse to have a more diverse group of students?
- 2. How has the relative lack of diversity impacted our class in particular; how do you think things would have gone differently if our class was more diverse?
- 3. Do you think Notre Dame should practice affirmative action? And if so, in what ways? Here are some things to consider: there are different ways of practicing it, e.g. encouraging certain groups to apply vs. giving applications from certain groups a slight edge. There are different groups to which it could be applied to, e.g. students, faculty, etc. There are different sorts of affirmative action that could be performed: we could pay attention to race, ethnicity, religion, age, sexual orientation, socio-economic status, geographical background, political leanings, etc.
